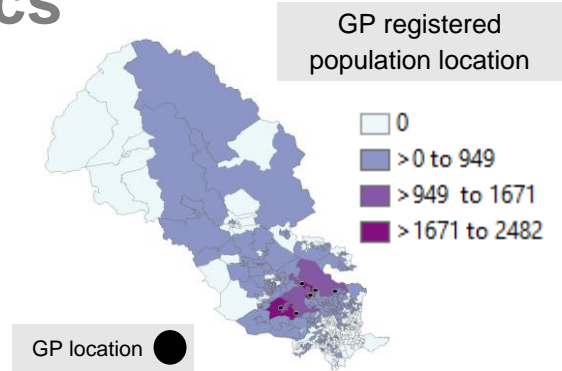


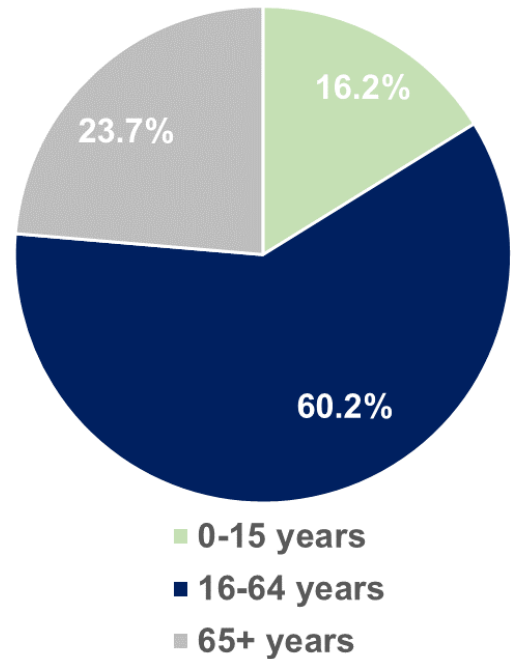
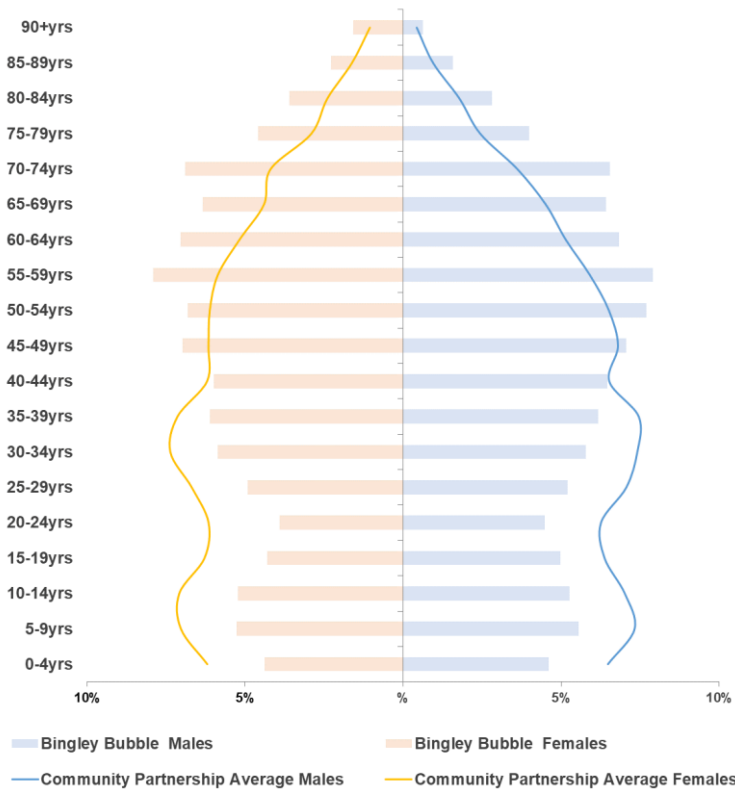

Population & Demographics

43,737 people are registered with GP practices in Bingley Bubble Community Partnership which forms part of the North Locality. 89% of the population resides in the Bingley, Bingley Rural and Baildon wards which are part of the Shipley area committee.



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Summary

The population of Bingley Bubble Community Partnership is generally older than the Bradford District and Craven CCG average. The health and wellbeing of Bingley Bubble Community Partnership is generally better than other parts of the CCG. Life expectancy for both males and females is above the CCG average. Furthermore premature mortality rates for respiratory disease, CVD and cancer are also below the CCG average. There are low rates of infant mortality and a low proportion of households that experience fuel poverty.

Life Expectancy

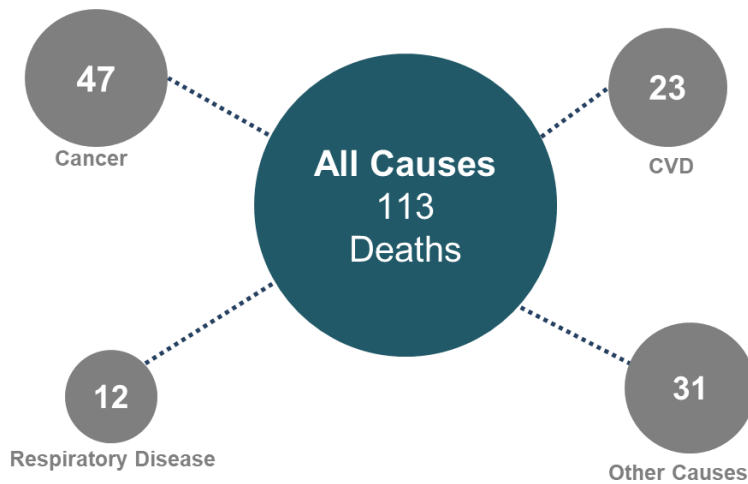
Three Year Averages

Death Rate: per 100,000 population

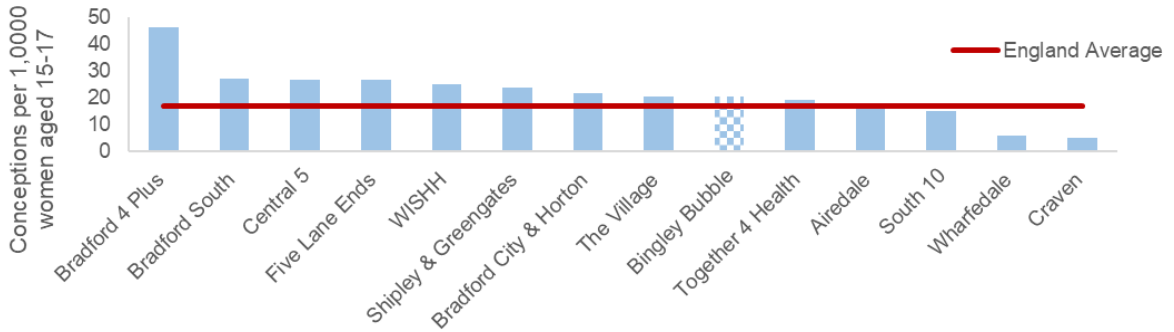

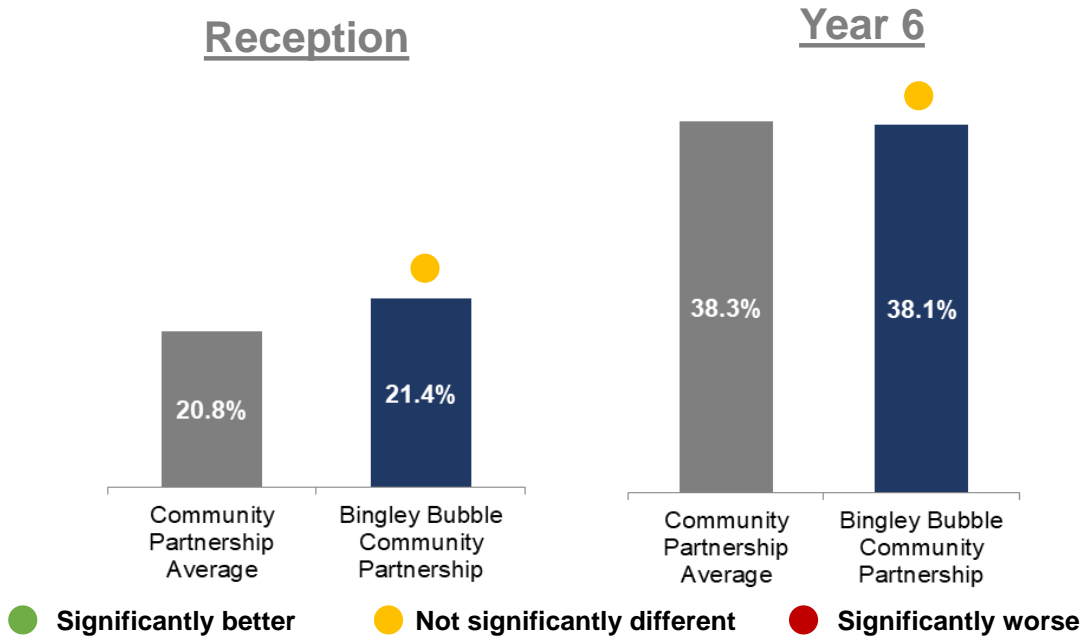
Teenage Pregnancy

2016-18



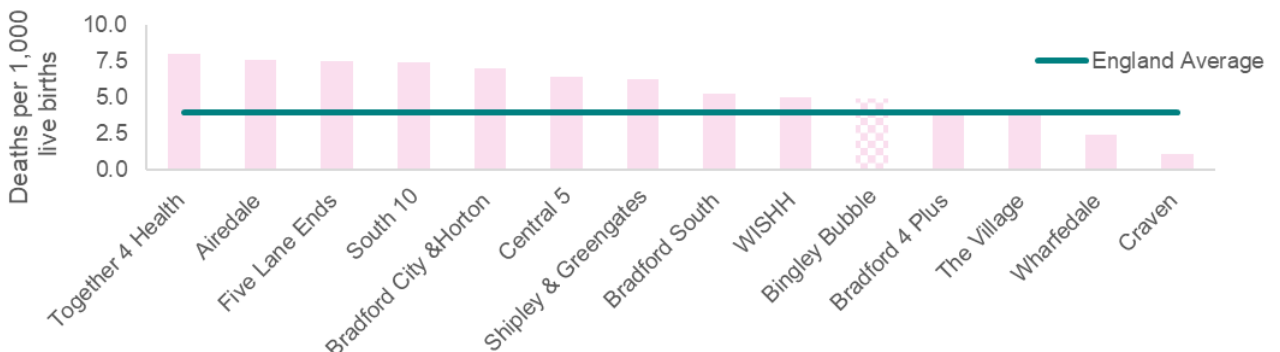
Child Excess Weight

2017/18 to 2019/20



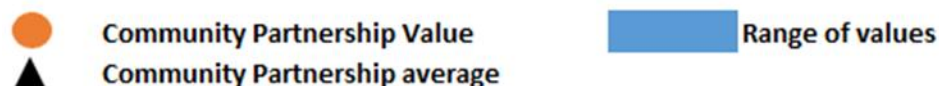
Infant Mortality
