

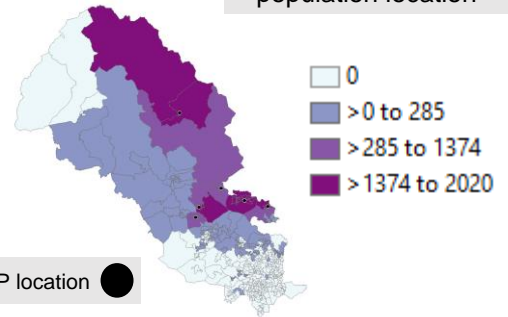

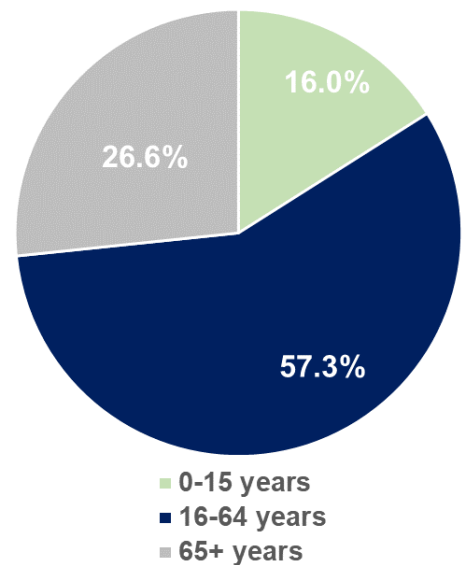
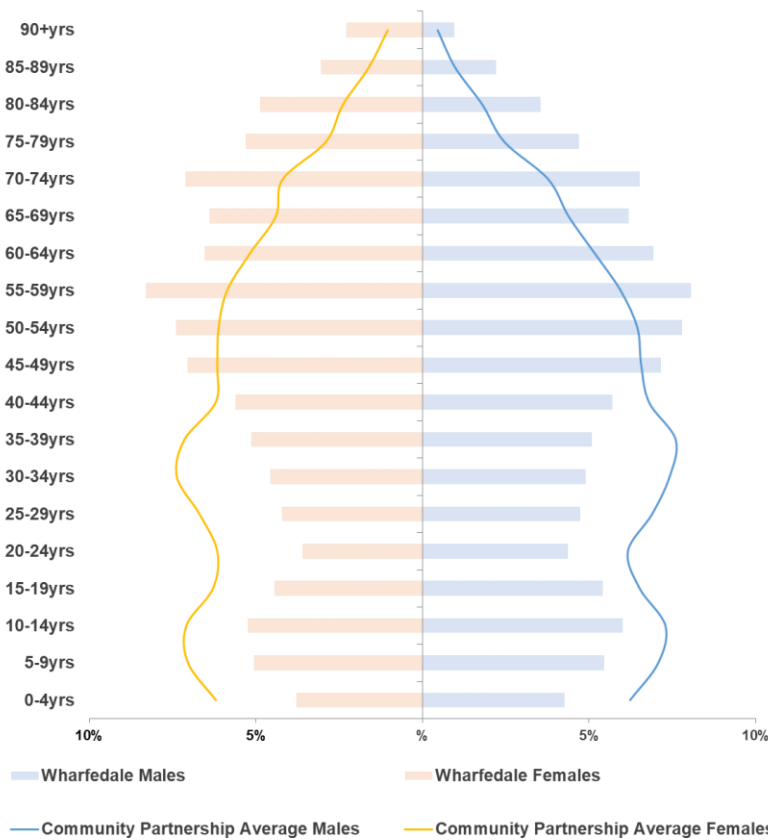
Population & Demographics

44,530 people are registered with GP practices in Wharfedale Community Partnership which forms part of the AWC Locality. 85% of the population reside in Ilkley, Craven and Wharfedale wards which form part of the Keighley and Shipley area committees.

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Summary

The population of Wharfedale Community Partnership is older than other areas of Bradford District and Craven. The health and wellbeing of the population of Wharfedale is generally better than other areas of Bradford District and Craven. Male and female life expectancy are above the average and there are low levels of premature mortality due to CVD, respiratory disease and cancer. There are low levels of infant mortality and U18 conceptions. However there are high levels of excess weight in year 6.

Life Expectancy

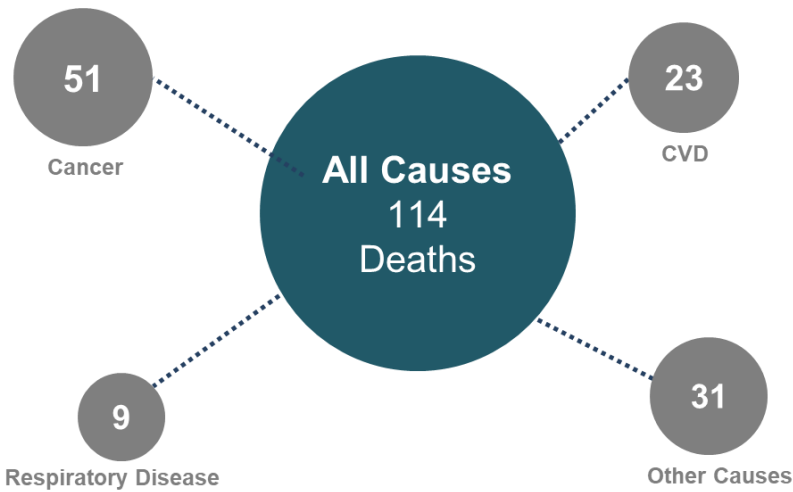
Three Year Averages

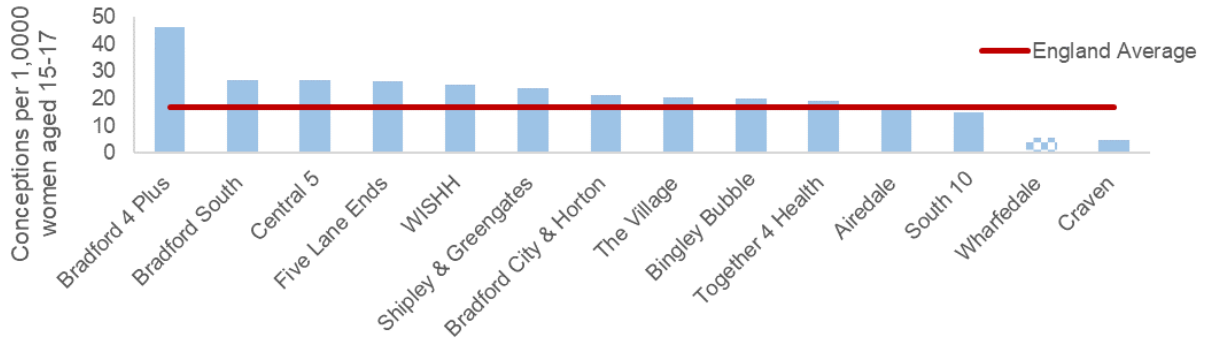

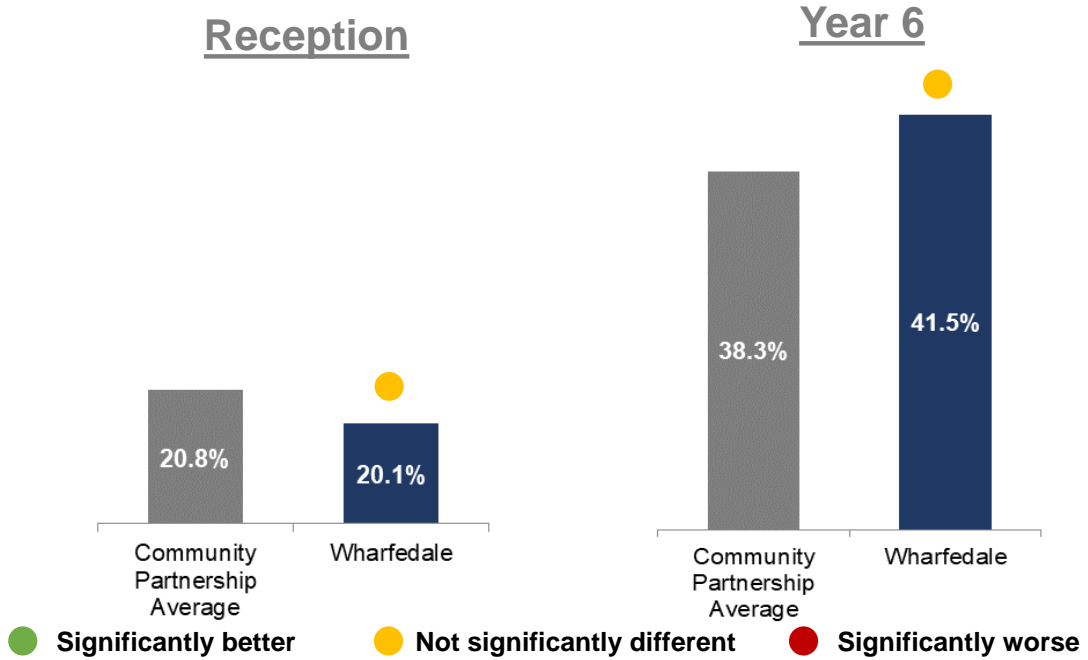
Teenage Pregnancy

2016-18



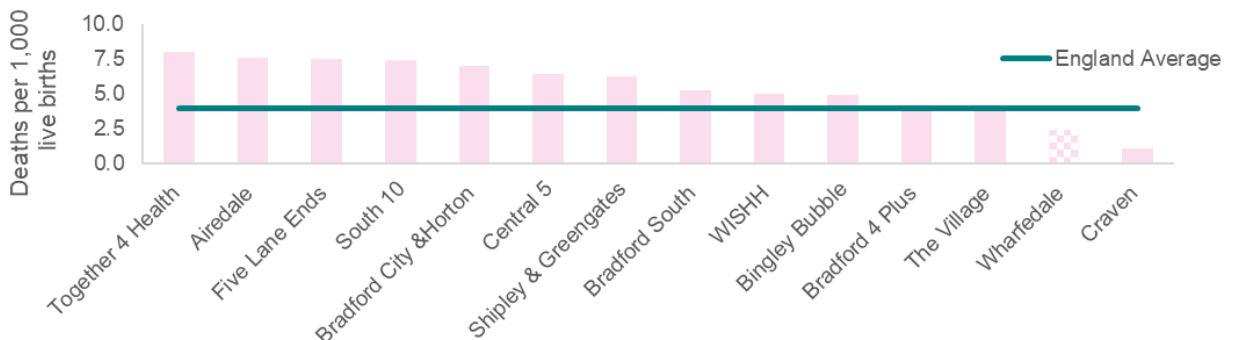
Child Excess Weight

2017/18 to 2019/20



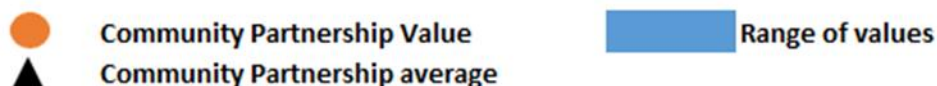
Infant Mortality
