51.1% of the population in Keighley and Ilkley are female which is similar to 50.9% in the district.

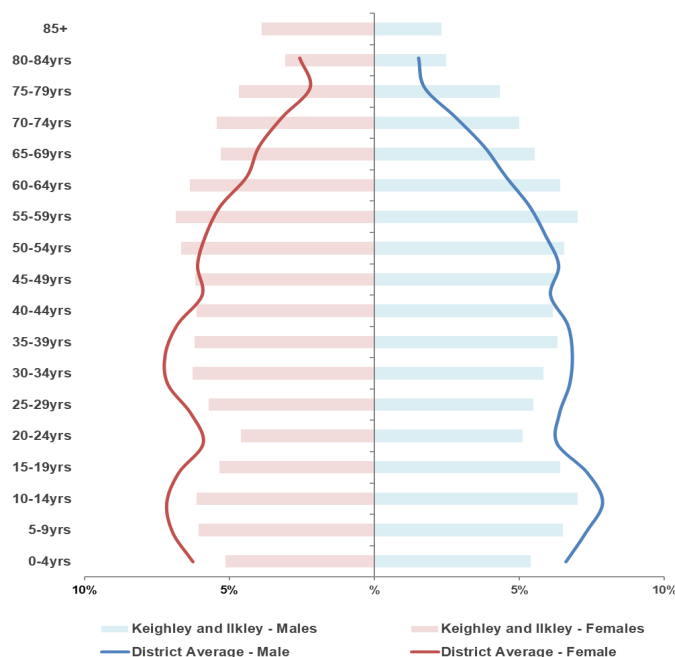
Keighley and Ilkley has a slightly higher proportion of males (48.9%) compared to the district (49.1%).

The graph shows the age distribution for the population of Keighley and Ilkley split by female and male.

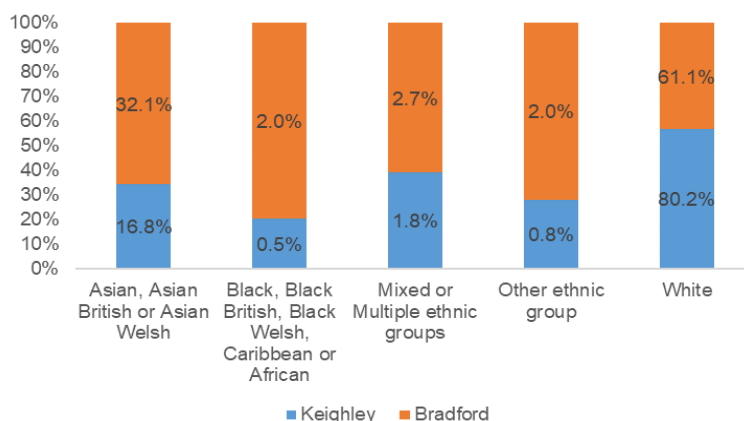
Keighley and Ilkley has a higher older population for both male and female compared to the district.

16.8% (16,677) of the population in Keighley and Ilkley describe themselves as Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh compared with 32.1% in the district.

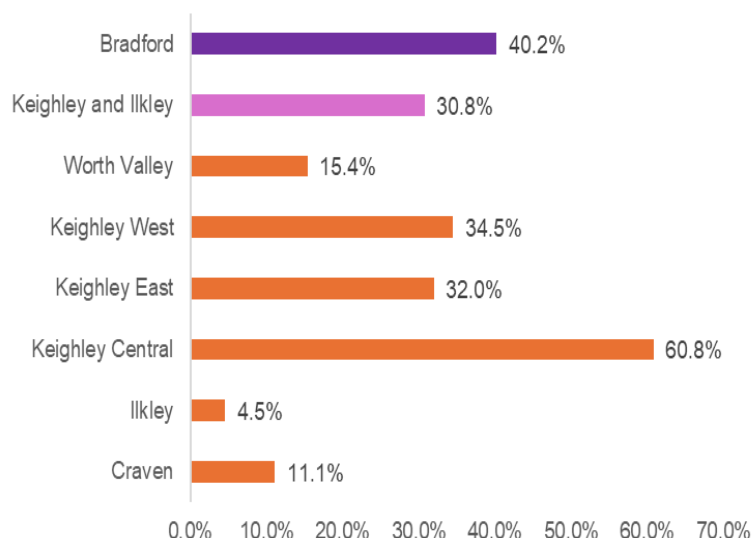

Children (aged under 16) in absolute low income families (2024)

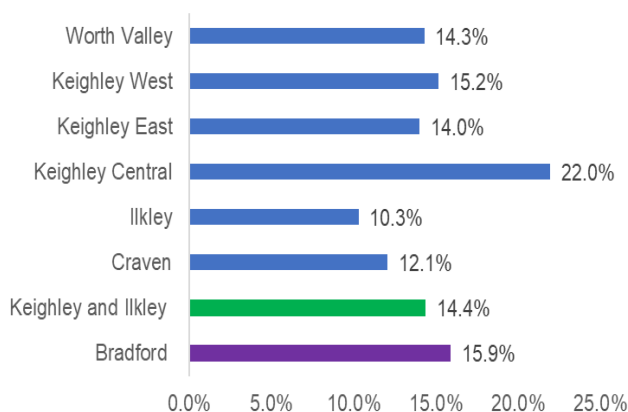


In 2024, there was an estimated 30.8% of children in Keighley and Ilkley (5,994) in low income families lower than the 40.2% for the Bradford district. The range within the constituency is between 4.5% (Ilkley) to 60.8% in Keighley Central a difference of 56.3% percentage points.

Fuel Poverty (2023)

In 2023, there was an estimated 6,267 (14.4%) of households in Keighley and Ilkley in fuel poverty compared to 15.9% in the district. (LSOA to best fit ward)

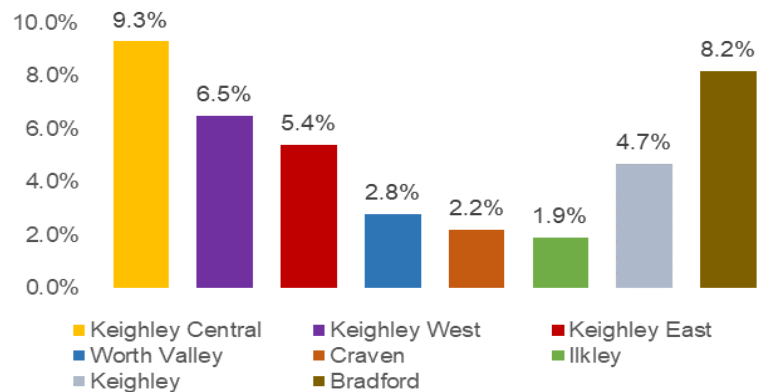
Keighley Central was estimated to have the highest proportion of households in fuel poverty with 22.0% which is the only ward higher than the district (15.9%). Ilkley had the lowest proportion at 10.3%.

Working age population claiming out of work benefit (2021-22)

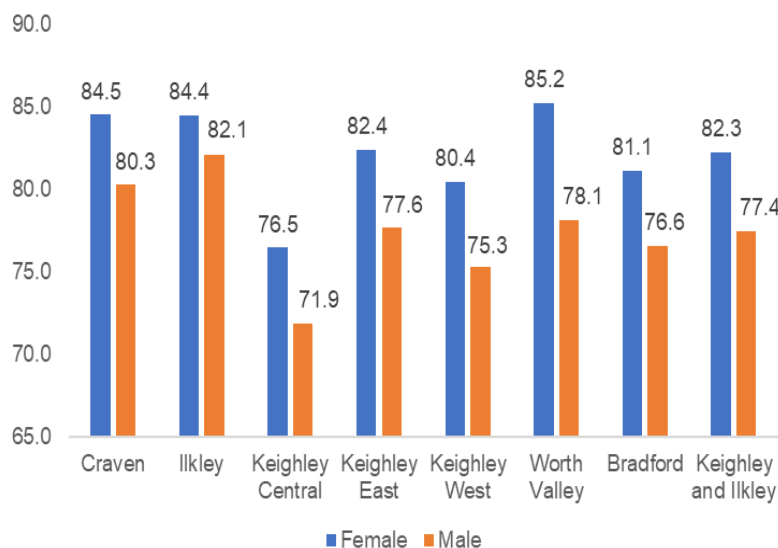
Keighley has a lower proportion (4.7%) of the working age population claiming out of work benefits compared to the district (8.2%).

Keighley Central has the highest proportion within the constituency (9.3%) followed by Keighley West at 6.5%. Ilkley had the lowest proportion at 1.9%.

Life Expectancy 2020-22



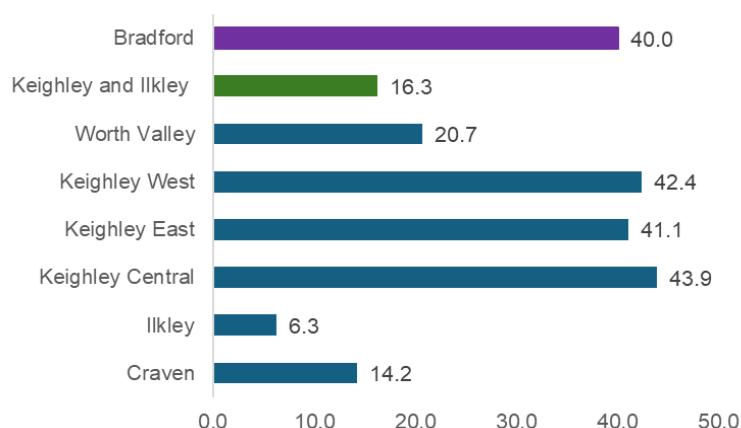
Female life expectancy is higher than the district average in four of the six Keighley and Ilkley wards.

The lowest female life expectancy was in Keighley Central (76.5 years) and the highest in Worth Valley (85.2 years followed by Ilkley (84.4 years)

The male life expectancy is higher than the district average in four of the six wards in Keighley and Ilkley. Keighley Central has the lowest life expectancy for males (71.9 years) with Ilkley the highest at 82.1 years.

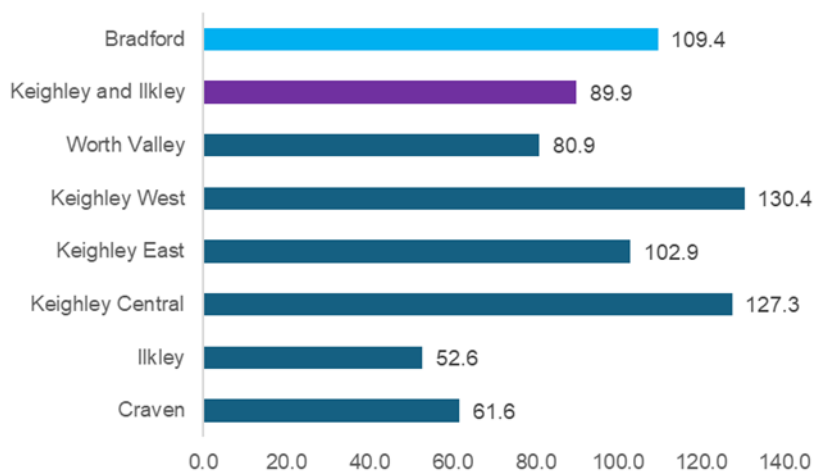
Premature mortality – Respiratory, Under 75 – (2020-22)

Keighley and Ilkley's under 75 respiratory mortality rate (16.3 per 100,000) is significantly better than the district average (40.0 per 100,000).



In 2020-22, Keighley Central (43.9 per 100,000) had the highest under 75 respiratory mortality rates in Keighley and Ilkley followed by Keighley West (42.4 per 100,000) higher than Bradford district. Ilkley had the lowest rate at 6.3 per 100,000.

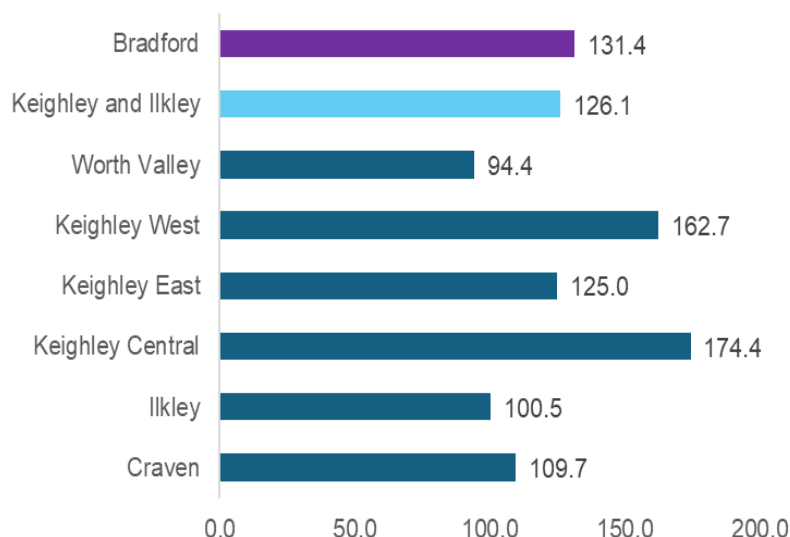
Premature mortality - cardiovascular diseases (CVD) - Under 75 (2020-22)



Keighley and Ilkley under 75 CVD mortality average (89.9 per 100,000) is better than the district average (109.4 per 100,000).

In 2020-22, Keighley West (130.4) had the highest under 75 CVD mortality rates in Keighley and Ilkley with Ilkley ward the lowest rate, 52.6 per 100,000.

Premature mortality (Under 75) - Cancer (2020-22)



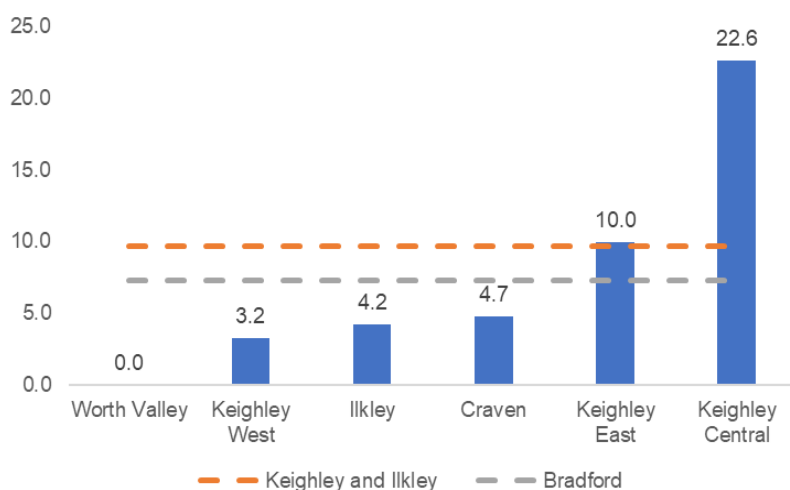
Keighley and Ilkley's under 75 cancer mortality average (126.1 per 100,000) is higher than the district average (131.4 per 100,000).

In 2020-22, Keighley Central (174.4 per 100,000) and Keighley West (162.7 per 100,000) had the highest U75 cancer mortality rates in Keighley and Ilkley.

Worth Valley had the lowest rate, 94.4 per 100,000 followed by Ilkley with 100.5 per 100,000.

Child Health

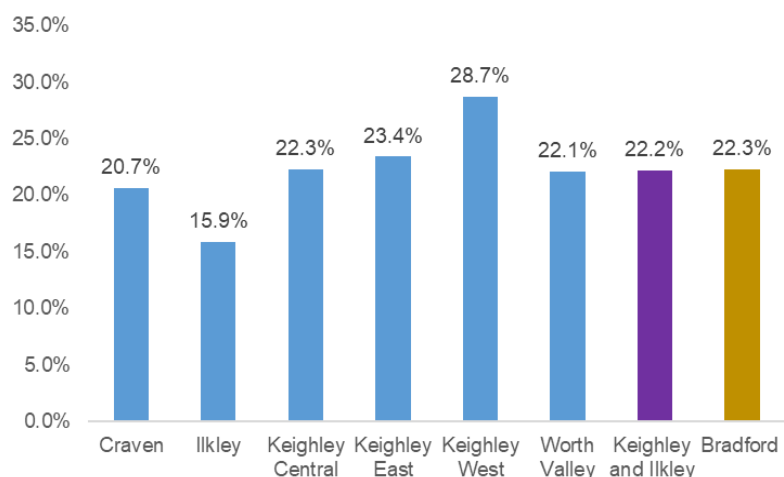
Infant Mortality 2021-2023



Keighley and Ilkley's infant mortality rate (9.7 per 1,000 live births) is higher than Bradford average (7.3 per 1,000 live births).

Keighley Central has the highest rate 22.6 per 1,000 live births within Keighley and Ilkley followed by Keighley East at 10.0 per 1,000 live births. Four of the six wards in Keighley and Ilkley were lower than Bradford rate of 7.3 per 1,000 live births.

Reception excess weight - 2021-22 to 2023-24



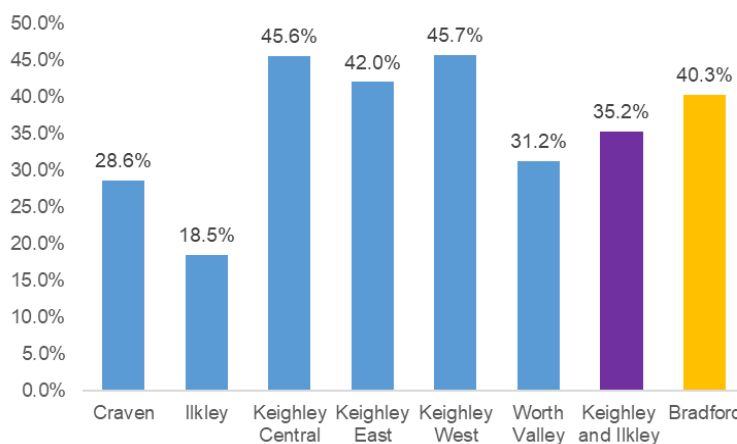
The prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (including obesity) in Keighley and Ilkley (22.2%) is slightly lower compared to the district average

Keighley West has the highest prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (28.7%) followed by Keighley East (23.4%) higher than the district.

Ilkley has the lowest prevalence of 15.9% within Keighley and Ilkley followed by Craven at 20.7%.

Year 6 excess weight – 2021-22 to 2023-24

Keighley and Ilkley's average Year 6 excess weight (35.2%) is below the district average (40.3%).



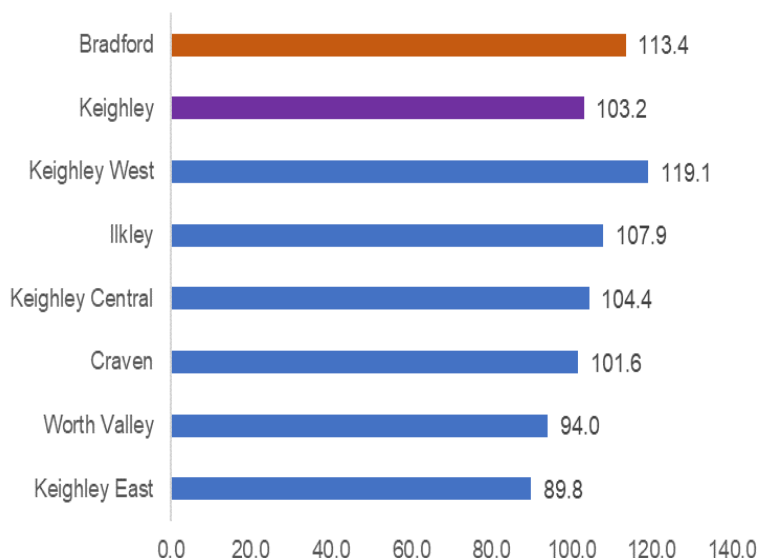
Keighley West has 45.7% of Year 6 children that are overweight or obese, which is higher than the district average, this is followed by Keighley Central with 45.6%.

Ilkley has the lowest prevalence of 18.5% followed by Craven (28.6%)

Emergency admissions due to injury in under 15 year olds (2016-21)

2016 – 2021 emergency admissions due to injury in children and young people under 15 years old rate is 119.1 per 10,000 population for Keighley and Ilkley.

This is lower than the district rate of 113.4 per 10,000.



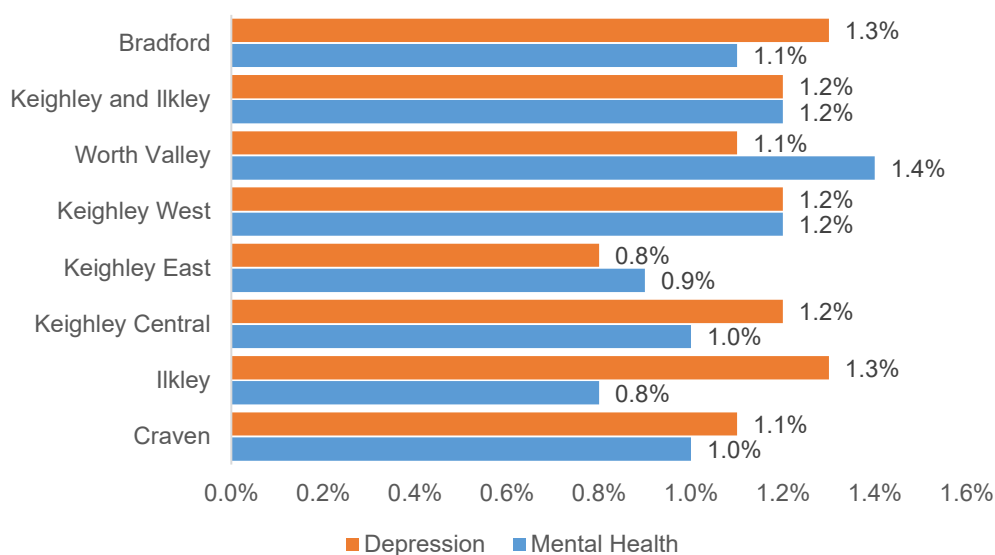
Keighley West had the highest rate in Keighley and Ilkley (119.1 per 10,000) with Ilkley 107.9 per 10,000. 5 of the 6 wards in Keighley were lower than the constituency rate and the district rate.

Depression and Mental Health - 2023-24

In 2023-24, the estimated prevalence for depression (new diagnosis) is 1.3% with 1.1% for mental health within Bradford. Ilkley is estimated to have the highest prevalence of depression (new diagnosis) 1.3% with Worth Valley the highest prevalence estimates (1.4%) for Mental Health.

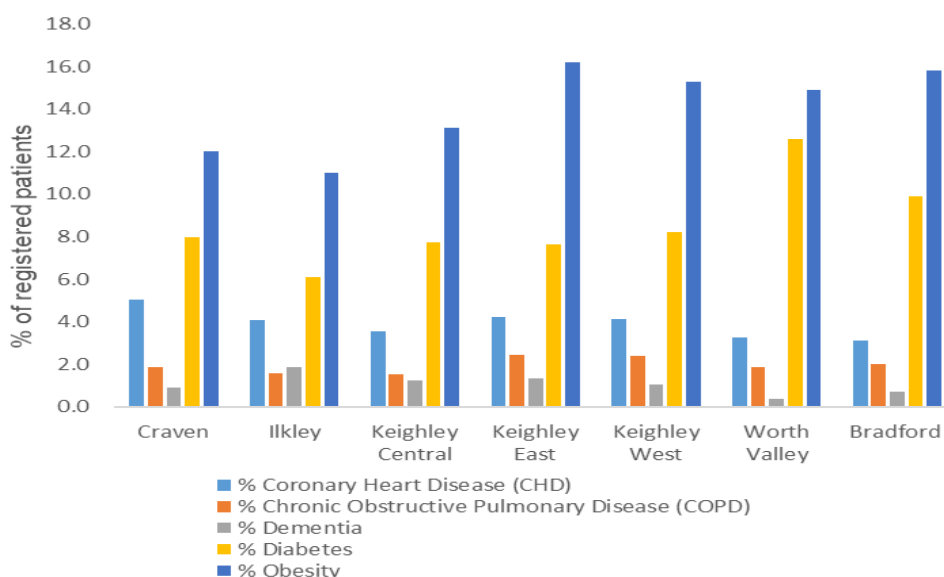

In 2023-24, the estimated prevalence for Coronary Heart Disease (CHD) for Bradford is 3.1% with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) 2.0%.

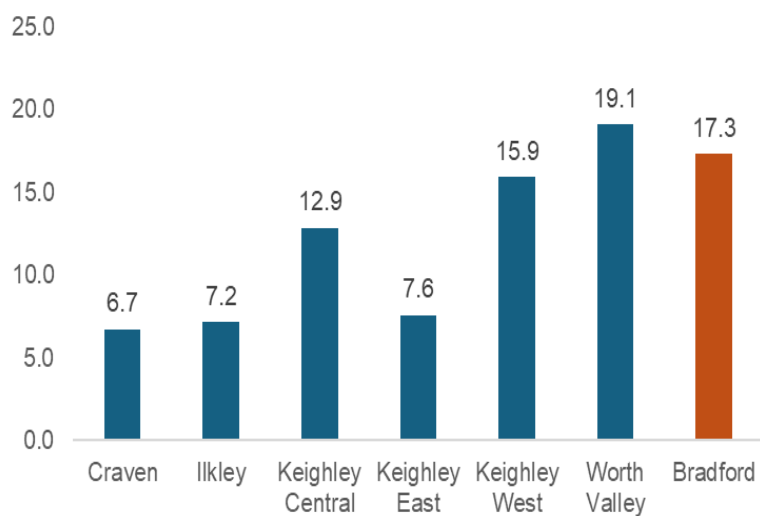
Craven has the highest estimated prevalence of CHD (5.0%) with Keighley Central the lowest at 3.1%. Keighley East and Keighley West having the highest estimated prevalence of COPD (2.4%) within Keighley and Ilkley.

Worth Valley is estimated to have the highest prevalence of diabetes at 12.6% and Keighley East the highest for obesity (16.2%). Ilkley is estimated to have the highest prevalence of dementia with 1.9% within other wards in Keighley and Ilkley this is ranged between 0.4% (Worth Valley) and 1.3% (Keighley East)

Smoking prevalence within Keighley and Ilkley ranges from 6.7% in Craven to 19.1% in Worth Valley.

17.3% of people 15 years and over within the Bradford District are estimated to be smokers.
