Bradford Cohort: Education and Healthcare Plan (EHCP) and SEN Support

Introduction

This report gives an overview of the Bradford SEND cohort, covering children and young people with an EHCP aged 0 to 25, and those receiving SEN Support, who are generally of school age. Data is taken from Bradford's SEND Dashboard at the date of this report.

Summary





Figure 1: Number of children and young people by type of need and SEND provision

Overall, 18,606 children in the Bradford district were receiving an EHCP or SEN support (**Table 1**; **Figure 1**). Just over 70% of need was met through SEN Support. Moderate Learning Difficulties and Speech, Communication and Language Needs accounted for 43% of all needs recorded. Both primary needs were mainly met through SEN support (94.7% and 74.8% respectively).

An EHCP was most likely to be in place for children with Autistic Spectrum Disorders, Severe Learning Difficulties or Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (Figure 1) (all >60% of the overall cohort for the specific need). Two-thirds of children with an Autistic Spectrum Disorder were recorded as having an EHCP in place, equating to 1,466 pupils; the largest number of children receiving an EHCP plan for any category of need. There were 608 children recorded as having a Severe Learning Difficulty, of which 95.6% had an EHCP in place.




Figure 2a and 2b: Age and gender distribution of children receiving a) EHCP and b) SEN support

There were a larger numbers of males than females across all age groups, for both EHCP and SEN Support (Figures 2a and 2b). Of all children with an EHCP in place 71.8% were male, and of those who were recorded as receiving SEN Support 63.2% were male.




Figure 3a and b: Ethnicity of children receiving a) EHCP and b) SEN Support

When considering the overall SEND cohort (EHCP and SEN Support combined), Asian was the most common broad ethnic group recorded for children under 5 years of age, accounting for 47.7% of all children in that age group (**Figure 3a and b**). For all other age groups White British was the most commonly recorded ethnicity (**Table 2**).
