Keighley Central (18,474) has the highest population of residents in Keighley followed by Craven with 17,701.


51.0% of the population in Keighley are female which is similar to 51.1% in the district. Keighley has a slightly higher proportion of males (49.0%) compared to

Age




60% of the population in Keighley are aged 16 to 64 years with 20% aged 15 years and under and 20% aged 65 years and over.


80.2% (79,669) of the population in Keighley describe themselves as White compared to 61.1% of the population in the district.


Children (aged under 16) in absolute low income families



In 2021, there was an estimated 44.1% of children in Keighley Central (2,159) in low income families compared to 26.6% for Keighley constituency and 28.9% for the Bradford district.

Ilkley was estimated 3.3% of children (82) which is the lowest across the district.


In 2020, there was an estimated 6,779 (15.8%) of households in Keighley in fuel poverty compared to 18.5% in the district.

Keighley Central was estimated to have 21.4% of households in fuel poverty, followed by Keighley West with 20.0%. 4 of the 6 wards in Keighley were lower than the district.

Unemployment (working age population claiming out of work benefit)

Keighley has a lower proportion (4.7%) of the working age population claiming out of work benefits compared to the district (8.2%).


Keighley Central has the highest proportion within the constituency (9.3%) followed by Keighley West at 6.5%. Ilkley had the lowest proportion at 1.9%.

Life Expectancy 2018-20




Female life expectancy is higher than the district average in five of the Keighley wards. The lowest female life expectance was in Keighley Central (77.5 years) and the highest in Worth Valley (85.4 years followed by Ilkley (84.6 years)


The male life expectancy is higher than the district average in five of the six wards in Keighley. Keighley Central has the lowest life expectancy for males (75.1 years) with Ilkley the highest at 81.1 years.

Premature mortality - Respiratory (Under 75)

Keighley's rates for under 75 respiratory mortality average (29.8 per 100,000) is significantly better than the district average (41.4 per 100,000). In 2018-20, Keighley Central (51.6 per 100,000) had the highest under 75 respiratory mortality rates in Keighley followed by Keighley West (46.5 per 100,000) higher than Bradford district.




Ilkley had the lowest rate at 12.7 per 100,000.



Premature mortality - cardiovascular diseases (CVD) - Under 75

Keighley's rates for U75 CVD mortality average (79.3 per 100,000) is significantly better than the district average (100.9 per 100,000). In 2018-20, Keighley Central (138.2) had the highest U75 CVD mortality rates in Keighley Constituency with Ilkley the lowest rate, 49.3 per 100,000.



Premature mortality (Under 75) - Cancer

Keighley's rates for U75 cancer mortality average (124.0 per 100,000) is higher than the district average (135.5 per 100,000).

In 2018-20, Keighley Central (188.1 per 100,000) and Keighley West (162.2 per 100,000) had the highest U75 cancer mortality rates in Keighley.


Ilkley had the lowest rate, 91.7 per 100,000 followed by Worth Valley with 97.3 per 100,000.

Child Health

Infant Mortality 2018-2020

Keighley's infant mortality rate (6.2 per 1,000 live births) is higher than Bradford average (6.0 per 1,000 live births).

Keighley Central has the highest rate 9.5 per 1,000 live births within Keighley followed by Worth Valley at 8.9 per 1,000 live births.

The prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (including obesity) in Keighley (22.1%) is lower compared to the district average (22.5%).

Keighley West has the highest prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (26.2%) followed by Keighley East (25.0%) higher than the district.


Ilkley has the lowest prevalence of 17.6% within Keighley Constituency.


Year 6 excess weight

Keighley's average Year 6 excess weight (37.0%) is below the district average (41.5%). Keighley Central has 45.2% of Year 6 children that are overweight or obese, which is higher than the district average.

Ilkley has the lowest prevalence of 19.7% followed by Craven (32.4%)

In 2017-19 the average under 18 conception rate in Keighley was 18.0 per 1,000 population lower than the district average of 17.2 per 1,000).


The highest rate was in the Worth Valley (21.2 per 1,000) with Keighley Central the lowest (8.6 per 1,000).

Emergency admissions due to injury in under 15 year olds


2016 – 2021 emergency

Keighley West had the highest rate in Keighley (119.1 per 10,000) with Ilkley 107.9 per 10,000. 5 of the 6 wards in Keighley were lower than the constituency rate and the district rate.

Depression and Mental Health

In 2020-21, the estimated prevalence for depression is 10.5% with 1.0% for mental health within Keighley. The estimated prevalence for the for depression district is 12.6%.

Keighley West is estimated to have the highest prevalence of depression followed by Keighley East. For mental health prevalence Keighley Central had the highest prevalence estimates (1.2%). The prevalence estimates for the district is 1.1%


Disease and Poor Health

Coronary Heart Disease (CHD), Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), Dementia, Diabetes and Obesity

In 2020-21, the estimated prevalence for Coronary Heart Disease (CHD) for Keighley is 3.6% with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) 2.1%.


Craven has the highest prevalence of CHD (4.1%) with Keighley West the highest prevalence (2.7%) within Keighley.

For diabetes Keighley Central is estimated to have the highest prevalence at 8.5% for diabetes and Keighley West the highest for obesity (7.4%).
