
City (23,707) has the highest population of residents in Bradford West followed by Manningham with 21,193 then Toller with an estimated 20,927 residents.

50.0% of the population in Bradford West are female compared to 51.1% in the district. Bradford West has a higher proportion of males (50.0%) compared to the district (48.9%).

### Age




58% of the population in Bradford West are aged 16 to 64 years. Bradford West's aged 19 years and under population is more than a third more than the population of 65 years and over. Bradford West has a higher proportion of residents aged 19 years and under (32%) compared to the overall district (28%) and a lower proportion of residents aged 65 years and over (10%) when compared to the overall district (15%).


## Age Distribution

## Ethnicity



61.0% (74,034) of the population in Bradford West describe themselves as Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh compared to 32.1% of the population in the district.


Other ethnic groups account for 4,228; 3.5% of the Bradford West compared to 2.0% of the Bradford district.

Bradford West has a higher proportion of Black, Black British, Black Welsh, Caribbean or African (3,793 – 3.1%) and Mixed or multiple ethnic group (3,462 – 2.9%) compared with the population of the district. 29.5% (35,838) of the population in Bradford West describe themselves as white compared with 61.1% in the district.

# Wider Determinants of Health

## Children (aged under 16) in absolute low income families (2024)



In 2024, there was an estimated 67.9% of children in Manningham (3,750) in low income families compared to 52.2% for Bradford West and 40.2% for the Bradford district.


Toller was estimated 62.3% of children (3,395) with Clayton and Fairweather Green the lowest with an estimated 35.4% (1,632)

In 2023, there was an estimated 7,807 (19.1%) of households in Bradford West in fuel poverty compared to 15.9% in the district




### Working age population claiming out of work benefit (2021-22)

Bradford West has a higher proportion (10.6%) of the working age population claiming out of work benefits compared to the district (8.2%). Manningham has the highest proportion within the constituency (14.4%) with Thornton and Allerton the lowest proportion at 7.7%.



# Life expectancy and causes of early death

## Life Expectancy 2020-22




Female life expectancy is similar to the district average in two of the Bradford West wards with all other wards lower. The lowest female life expectancy was in Manningham (77.0 years) and the highest in Thornton and Allerton (81.6 years).

The male life expectancy is below the district average in five of the six wards in Bradford West, Thornton and Allerton was the only ward lower than the district average at 77.2 years. City has the lowest life expectancy for males (70.4 years).


## Premature mortality – Respiratory, Under 75 – (2020-22)

Bradford West's rates for under 75 respiratory mortality average (50.6 per 100,000) is worse than the district average (40.0 per 100,000).



In 2020-22, Toller (62.7) had the highest under 75 respiratory mortality rates in Bradford West with Heaton the lowest rate 35.6 per 100,000.


## Premature mortality - cardiovascular diseases (CVD) - Under 75 (2020-22)



Bradford West's rates for U75 CVD mortality average (134.5 per 100,000) is worse than the district average (109.4 per 100,000).

In 2020-22, City (216.0) had the highest under 75 CVD mortality rates in the Bradford West Constituency with Thornton and Allerton the lowest rate, 93.7 per 100,000.

## Premature mortality (Under 75) - Cancer (2020-22)




Bradford West's rates for under 75 cancer mortality average (141.0 per 100,000) is higher than the district average (131.4 per 100,000).

In 2020-22, Clayton and Fairweather Green (168.0) had the highest under 75 cancer mortality rates in Bradford West with Heaton the lowest rate, 104.9 per 100,000.

# Child Health


## Infant Mortality (2021-2023)



Bradford West's infant mortality rate (8.7 per 1,000 live births) is higher than Bradford average (7.3 per 1,000 live births).

City has the highest rate 12.4 per 1,000 live births within Bradford West with Thornton and Allerton the lowest (4.3 per 1,000 live births). Four of the six wards in Bradford West were higher than district average.

## Reception excess weight - 2021-22 to 2023-24




The prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (including obesity) in Bradford West (21.5%) is lower compared to the district average (22.3%).

City has the highest prevalence of reception aged children who are overweight (23.7%) followed by Clayton and Fairweather Green (22.6%). Manningham had the lowest prevalence with 19.1%. Four of the six wards within Bradford West were lower than the district.

## Year 6 excess weight – 2021-22 to 2023-24


The prevalence of Year 6 aged children who are overweight (including obesity) in Bradford West (42.9%) is higher compared to the district average (40.3%).



Thornton and Allerton has the highest prevalence of year 6 aged children who are overweight (44.7%) City (44.4%). Heaton had the lowest prevalence with 40.8%. All of the six wards within Bradford West were higher than the district.

## Emergency admissions due to injury in under 15 year olds (2016-21)

2016 – 2021 emergency admissions due to injury in children and young people under 15 years old rate is 119.5 per 10,000 population for Bradford West. This is higher than the district rate of 113.4 per 10,000.




Thornton and Allerton had the highest rate in Bradford West (133.1 per 10,000) with Manningham 128.0 per 10,000. 3 of the 6 wards in Bradford West were lower than Bradford West and the district rate.

# Mental Health

## Depression and Mental Health - 2023-24

In 2023-24, the new diagnosis of depression rate is 1.3% for the Bradford district. Two of the six wards had a higher diagnosis rate than the district. Manningham and Toller had the highest new diagnosis rate (1.5%) with City the lowest at 0.6%.



City has the highest prevalence estimates (3.2%) for Mental Health followed by Thornton and Allerton with 1.4%.

Three of the six wards were higher than the District.


## Coronary Heart Disease (CHD), Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), Dementia, Diabetes and Obesity (2023-24)

In 2023-24, the estimated prevalence for Coronary Heart Disease (CHD) for Bradford is 3.1% with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) at 2.0%.

Clayton and Fairweather Green has the highest prevalence of CHD (3.4%) and COPD (2.5%) within Bradford West. For diabetes Manningham is estimated to have the highest prevalence at 15.3% for diabetes and obesity (18.9%).




## Smoking Prevalence (15 years +) - 2023-24

Smoking prevalence within Bradford West ranges from 15.4% in Heaton to 38.3% in City. Four of the six wards in Bradford West are higher than the district average.

17.9% of people 15 years + within the Bradford District are estimated to be smokers.
